Welcome to the Chapel

The chapel exists for every member of Trinity Hall and is available for private prayer, or simply quietness and reflection, any hour of the day or evening outside service times.

Services are according to the rites of the Church of England, but everyone is welcome to attend services. Anyone who receives communion in their own church, whether they are Anglican or not, is invited to receive communion in chapel. There is no dress code and it is not necessary to wear a gown.

As well as charge of chapel, the Dean of Chapel has pastoral responsibility for the whole college (regardless of belief). All are welcome to contact him at any time to speak with him about anything in confidence.
